Subject	COVID 19 – 19 July 2021 - Visiting Leisure Vessels

19 July - Visiting Leisure Vessels

If you are fully vaccinated and 14 days have passed since your second vaccination, there will be no isolation or testing requirements if you are arriving from the Common Travel Area (**except Jersey**). This means you will be in the “blue channel” travel category. Accepted proof of vaccination status can be found here [COVID Status Certificates \(Vaccine Passports\) | States of Guernsey - COVID-19 \(gov.gg\)](#)

If you are not fully vaccinated or if you have had both doses of vaccination but 14 days have not passed since your second dose, then country and region categories will apply as normal. More info on categories can be found at: <https://covid19.gov.gg/guidance/travel/countries>.

The Common Travel Area (CTA) includes the United Kingdom, the Bailiwick of Guernsey, the Bailiwick of Jersey, the Isle of Man and the Republic of Ireland. **However, Jersey is now subject to additional controls.**

If travelling into the Bailiwick from anywhere outside the CTA, the current country category isolation and testing requirements apply. If you have been outside the CTA in the 14 days before you arrive in the Bailiwick then the country category applies regardless of your vaccination status.

It is important to note that Public Health will still apply overrides to country or region listings if it has any concerns. This CAN include countries/regions within the Common Travel Area.

If you intend to visit the Bailiwick of Guernsey and you have departed from and remained solely within the **Common Travel Area (except Jersey)** for the last 14 days and **all** onboard have been double vaccinated for at least 14 days you must:

- Register on the Travel Tracker and enter your journey within 2 days prior to arrival in the Bailiwick. [Welcome to the Travel Tracker | Guernsey Travel Tracker \(gov.gg\)](#)

- Additionally, If your destination is Alderney, complete a 'Recreational Vessel – Booking form' available here: [CHttpHandler.ashx \(gov.gg\)](#) at least 48 hrs before arriving in Braye harbour.
- Initially proceed to St Peter Port harbour for clearance, if your destination is in Guernsey, Herm or Sark; or proceed to Braye Harbour if your destination is in Alderney.
- Present your Travel Tracker information to COVID Test Team Staff to confirm your "Blue" status.
- Once confirmed you will be issued with a States of Guernsey "COVID Clear" sticker to display in the windscreen or prominent place on the vessel.
- You may now proceed to the Visitors Marina or other locations within the Bailiwick.

The testing facility for private vessels will be open between 09:00-11:00 and 16:00-18:00 only. If you arrive outside of these working hours, you should proceed to an isolation pontoon and await the attendance of Harbour and/or Border Agency personnel the following morning.

Visiting Vessels from Jersey

From Monday 19 July, travellers from the Bailiwick of Jersey to the Bailiwick of Guernsey will be required to present a negative PCR test before travelling. Any travellers not able to do so will be treated as Category 4 and will be required to self-isolate for 14 days.

The requirement, from 19 July 2021, for a pre-travel test will apply to fully vaccinated adults and all children aged 5 or older who accompany fully vaccinated adults. There will be no other

travel-related testing or self-isolation requirements applied to those travellers although the use of the Travel Tracker is still required.

Unvaccinated or partially vaccinated adults and the children who accompany them are already and will continue to be subject to 'Category 4' requirements testing and self-isolation requirements.

If you intend to visit the Bailiwick of Guernsey and you have departed from and remained solely within a **Category 2** region over the last 14 days you must:

- Register on the Travel Tracker and enter your journey within 2 days prior to arrival in the Bailiwick. [Welcome to the Travel Tracker | Guernsey Travel Tracker \(gov.gg\)](#)
- Additionally, If your destination is Alderney, complete a 'Recreational Vessel – Booking form' available here: [CHttpHandler.ashx \(gov.gg\)](#) at least 48 hrs before arriving in Braye Harbour.
- Initially proceed to St Peter Port harbour for clearance, if your destination is in Guernsey, Herm or Sark; or proceed to Braye Harbour if your destination is in Alderney.
- You will be directed to the self-isolation pontoons and advised of the requirements for undertaking your day of arrival test
- Once you have taken a Covid test on arrival you will be required to self-isolate on board until receipt of a negative test result.
- **Please note – This may take up to 48 hours depending on the volume of tests being processed.**
- When proceeding to and from the testing facility, you must wear a face covering and maintain 2M social distance from others and please bring your smart device with you to log on to the Travel Tracker.
- Continue in passive follow-up until Day 14, with a further test at day 7. Details in respect of passive follow up can be found at [Current Travel Requirements | States of Guernsey - COVID-19 \(gov.gg\)](#)
- If travelling with family members or friends, you must all continue to self-isolate until **EVERYONE** in the party receives a negative test result.

Please note that Covid tests are chargeable at £25 per test.

The testing facility for private vessels will be open between 09:00-11:00 and 16:00-18:00 only. If you arrive outside of these working hours, you should proceed to an isolation pontoon and await the attendance of Harbour and/or Border Agency personnel the following morning.

You will not be able to access shower and heads facilities until you have received a negative test result and should ensure you have enough food and water for all crew members for 48 hours.

The Bailiwick of Guernsey will not be accepting visiting vessels from Category 3 or Category 4 regions or countries who do not qualify for “Blue” status.
