Subject	COVID 19 – 4 October 2021 - Visiting Leisure Vessels

The Civil Contingencies Authority (CCA) has announced the travel rules that will be in place from 4 October 2021.

Travel within the Common Travel Area (CTA) - Blue Channel

All travel from the CTA regardless of vaccination status will be treated as 'blue'. This means:

- Required to purchase a lateral flow test (LFT) pack for £25 per person.
- No isolation requirements.
- No testing for children 11 years and under.

Travel from outside of the Common Travel Area (CTA) - All travel from outside of the CTA within the last 10 days

For vaccinated travellers - from rest of the world

- Day 1 PCR test for travellers aged 12 and over.
- No isolation.
- Children aged 11 and under will not be tested and will follow the same self-isolation requirements as accompanying parents/guardians.
- Children aged 12-17 will be tested and follow the same self-isolation requirements as accompanying parents/guardians.
- 16 and 17 year olds with one dose of vaccine are considered fully vaccinated, regardless of parents/guardian vaccination status.
- If you decline to take a test, you must self-isolate for 7 days.

For unvaccinated travellers - from rest of the world

- Day 1 and Day 8 tests for travellers aged 12 and over.
- Isolate until Day 8 negative result.
- Children aged 11 and under will not be tested and will follow the same self-isolation requirements as accompanying parents/guardians.

- Children aged 12-17 will be tested and follow the same self-isolation requirements as accompanying parents/guardians.
- If you decline to take a test, you must self-isolate for 10 days.

For all travellers, vaccinated and unvaccinated, travelling directly into the Bailiwick from a region on the UKs red list

- Day 1 and Day 9 PCR tests for travellers aged 12 and over.
- Isolate until Day 9 negative result.
- Children aged 11 and under will not be tested and will follow the same self-isolation requirements as accompanying parents/guardians.
- Children aged 12-17 will be tested and follow the same self-isolation requirements as accompanying parents/guardians.
- If you decline to take a test, you must self-isolate for 14 days.

For all travellers, vaccinated and unvaccinated, travelling from a region on the UKs red list via the UK into the Bailiwick

- You cannot transit through the UK. You must complete self-isolation requirements in the UK.
- Once completed, you can travel as a Blue Channel traveller. (See Blue Channel above).

Visiting Vessels

If you are returning to the Bailiwick of Guernsey and you have departed from and remained solely within the **Common Travel Area (CTA)** for the last 10 days :

- Register on the Travel Tracker and enter your journey within 2 days prior to arrival in the Bailiwick. [Welcome to the Travel Tracker | Guernsey Travel Tracker \(gov.gg\)](https://www.gov.gg/travel-tracker)

- Initially proceed to St Peter Port harbour for clearance, if your destination is in Guernsey, Herm or Sark; or proceed to Braye Harbour if your destination is in Alderney.
- Present your Travel Tracker information to COVID Test Team Staff to confirm your “Blue” status.
- Once confirmed you will be issued with a States of Guernsey “COVID Clear” sticker to display in the windscreen or prominent place on the vessel.
- You will be issued with 5 Lateral Flow Tests
- You may now proceed to the Visitors Marina or other locations within the Bailiwick.

The testing facility opening times:

09.00 to 11.00 and 16.00 to 18.00 daily

If you arrive outside of these working hours, you should proceed to an isolation pontoon and await the attendance of Harbour and/or Border Agency personnel the following morning.

If you are returning to the Bailiwick of Guernsey from outside of the **CTA** but not from a **UK Red List** [Red, amber, green lists: check the rules for travel to England from abroad - GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](#) region:

- Register on the Travel Tracker and enter your journey within 2 days prior to arrival in the Bailiwick. [Welcome to the Travel Tracker | Guernsey Travel Tracker \(gov.gg\)](#)

- Additionally, If your destination is Alderney, complete a ‘Recreational Vessel – Booking form’ available here: [CHttpHandler.ashx \(gov.gg\)](#) at least 48 hrs before arriving in Braye Harbour.
- Initially proceed to St Peter Port harbour for clearance, if your destination is in Guernsey, Herm or Sark; or proceed to Braye Harbour if your destination is in Alderney.
- You will be directed to the self-isolation pontoons and advised of the requirements for undertaking your day of arrival test and the self-isolation requirements (if any) that apply in your case.

- When proceeding to and from the testing facility, you must wear a face covering and maintain 2M social distance from others and please bring your smart device with you to log on to the Travel Tracker.

The testing facility opening times:

09.00 to 11.00 and 16.00 to 18.00 daily

If you arrive outside of these working hours, you should proceed to an isolation pontoon and await the attendance of Harbour and/or Border Agency personnel the following morning.

If you are arriving into the Bailiwick directly from a **UK Red List region** [Red, amber, green lists: check the rules for travel to England from abroad - GOV.UK \(www.gov.uk\)](#) you must:

- Register on the Travel Tracker and enter your journey within 2 days prior to arrival in the Bailiwick. [Welcome to the Travel Tracker | Guernsey Travel Tracker \(gov.gg\)](#)

- Using the address:

- You must arrive into the Bailiwick via St Peter Port or Braye Harbour.
- You will be directed to the self-isolation pontoons and advised of the requirements for undertaking your day of arrival test.
- Once you have taken a COVID test you may proceed back to your mooring or onward to your place of isolation as directed by the Guernsey Border Agency (GBA).
- When proceeding to and from the testing facility, you must wear a face covering and maintain 2M social distance from others and please bring your smart device with you to log on to the Travel Tracker.

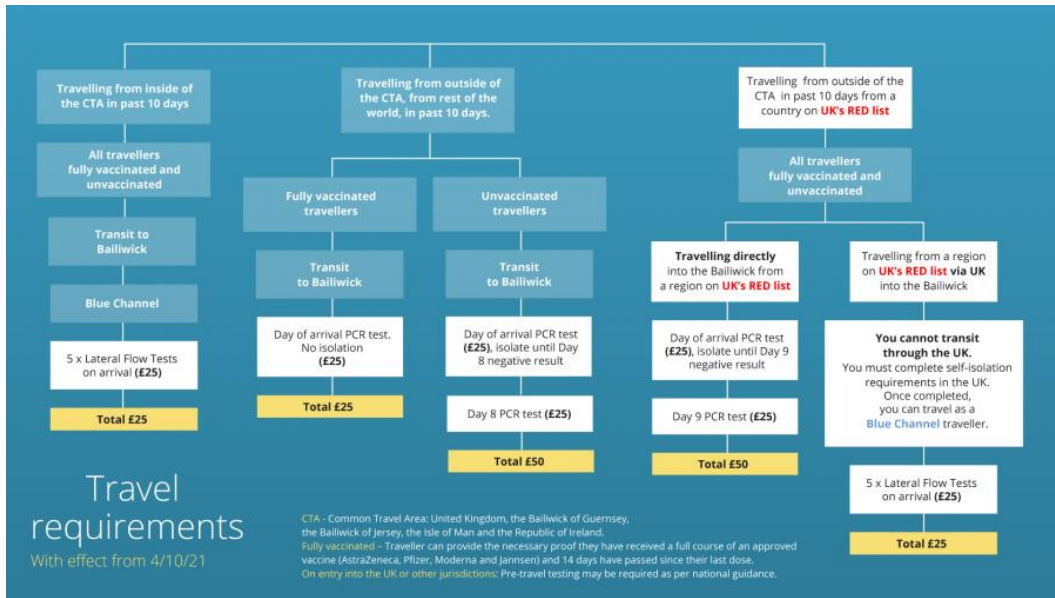
The testing facility opening times:
